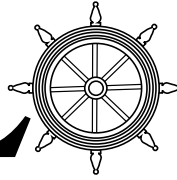

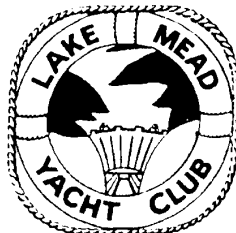

Meet Commodore Jim Lang and his mate Joan Kilburn

Jim is a California native and spent his early years in the San Gabriel Valley. He graduated from Azusa High School in 1964, attended Citrus Junior College with an AA degree in 1966, graduated from California State College at Fullerton with a BA in Business Finance and finished with an MBA degree in 1970 at Fullerton. He participated in student government activities throughout college and was student body president at Citrus and senior class president at Fullerton. Jim also was active in the Greek Fraternal organization and Delta Chi and received various academic honors at Fullerton and Citrus.



After college Jim had a brief employment period with a California CPA firm, then moved to Las Vegas in 1970 and went to work for the Fremont Hotel & Casino and became Controller in 1974. He then got involved in the Hotel Accountants Association and eventually became president. 1975 saw him changing employment to eventually becoming General Manager and a licensed key employee by the State of Nevada at the King 8 Hotel and Casino. The organization purchased the Bourbon Street Hotel and Casino in 1987 and for three years Jim operated both operations as Vice President and General Manager. Now the 90's hit and Jim formed a company and leased the Royal Hotel and Casino. He was licensed again for this operation by the State of Nevada and opened live gaming and developed a timeshare operation until he sold it in 2002.

After 30 years in the hotel and gaming industry Jim wanted to do something different and since his interest in boating was a top priority, what a perfect time to become a Marine Surveyor. In April of 2004 he was accepted by the Society of Accredited Marine Surveyors (SAMS) as a Surveyor Associate and formed his own company known as Northstar Marine Survey.

His significant other, Joan Kilburn, met Jim at the King 8 Hotel in 1979. Joan was Hotel and Sales Manager for the King 8 in 1979 and Vice President of Operations for Bourbon Street property with Jim in 1987. After Bourbon Street, Joan operated the Royal Hotel and Casino with Jim until it sold in 2002. They have been together for a number of years as you can see by this bio and Jim says they have a very strong personal relationship that includes joining him in the creation of Northstar Marine Survey. Doesn't this just sound like Jim talking...

Jim is an only child with both parents residing in Las Vegas. His parents have attended a few functions. Joan has two sons from a previous life and for those that were at the installation, the bartender, Eric is one of them.

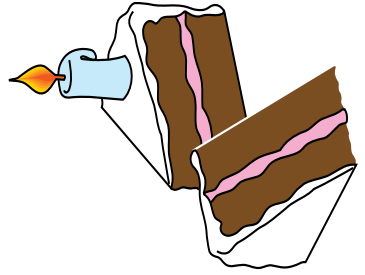

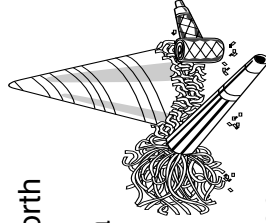

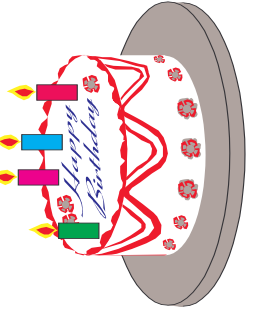
